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
















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




ACCREDITATION BADGES

Please always carry your accreditation badge with you. Your Industry@Tallinn & Baltic Event badge is the only document that gives you entry to the industry events and press and industry screenings.

With the Festival+Industry@Tallinn & Baltic Event badge, in order to secure a seat at a festival screening, one free ticket can be taken out beforehand per screening on the day of the screening (max 4 tickets per day). You can do this at the Guest Information Desk at Nordic Hotel Forum. This ticket is only valid with your badge so always bring your badge to the cinema.

As the tickets are sold/issued on a "first come – first served" basis, a seat to all screenings is not guaranteed. You may also go straight to the screening halls and after checking the availability of seats at the ticket counter in the cinema, you may enter by presenting only your Festival+Industry@Tallinn & Baltic Event badge not more than 5 min-

utes before the start of the screening. Please note that in this case the festival volunteers have a priority before any other badge. The badge is personal and should not be misused. If you lose the badge, please immediately inform the Guest Information Desk at Nordic Hotel Forum.

The Industry@Tallinn & Baltic Event badge also gives you access to many discounts around the city, the list of restaurants and cafes offering special guest discounts can be found at the festival website and in the booklet PÖFF RECOMMENDS. FOOD, DRINK & FEELING, which is available at all the festival info desks, Nordic Hotel Forum.

Please be considerate of other cinemagoers and attend screenings in time. Unfortunately, late admissions are not allowed.

Similarly, using phones during public screenings is strictly prohibited.

GETTING AROUND BY TAXI

Most of the festival venues are within walking distance from your hotel but if you need to take a taxi then here are some tips. Estonian taxis have metres and the prices range from 0.5 EUR/per km to 0.9 EUR/km. There is also a starting price, which is usually around 3.5 EUR. The prices are displayed on the car windows, please check them before getting in. The volunteers at the Guest Information Desk can always help you find a taxi, but you can also use handy apps (Bolt or Uber) to call a taxi that is nearby and offers credit card payment via the app.

Tallinn is usually safe for visitors but occasionally there might be drivers who try to take advantage of foreigners. Therefore, please

discuss the price beforehand or use any of the following reputable companies.

Explore Tallinn

If you have some time off, we recommend venturing out of the hotel and cinemas and exploring our beautiful city. Please see a few suggestions below. Please ask the volunteers at the Guest Information Desk to point out these spots on the map or better yet, ask for their favourite place in Tallinn.

Tallinn Christmas Market, christmasmarket.ee/eng/

At the Town Hall Square of Tallinn, next to the majestic Town Hall, a Christmas market will be held from November 16, 2018. The heart of the action is the most important Christmas tree in Estonia, surrounded by Christmas cabins/stands. Merchants will be offering a broad range of handicrafts, not found in regular shops. Guests can chat directly to masters and buy Christmas decorations and other handicrafts as original gifts for filling the sack of Santa Claus. Local caterers are offering Estonian Christmas cuisine and body- and soul-warming Christmas drinks.

Design and fashion shopping in Tallinn, visitestonia.com

If you'd like to adorn your home with the pearls of Estonian design, step in the shops and galleries you stroll past that sell designer creations. There is a wide range to choose from, so everyone is sure to find something to their liking. You can buy clothing and accessories, jewellery, furniture, home textiles, glass items, elements of interior design or even a designer bath tub!

Check the **Tallinn Design Map** at tallinn.design - it is your guide to the original Estonian design in the public space of Tallinn.

A fantastic way to get a feel for Tallinn is to head to one of the city's many excellent view spots. In fact, there are a lot of creative ways to get sweeping panoramas of the Old Town and city centre, charming views of the mediaeval streets and rooftops, or spectacular glimpses of Tallinn shoreline.

Viewing platforms on Toompea Hill -

Kohtuotsa, Patkuli, and Bishops Garden

Toompea hill offers unforgettable views of the medieval neighbourhood and is easily the city's most famous photo spot. From here you can see most of Tallinn's centuries-old spires as well as its newer ones, the highest of which is the TV Tower visible in the distance. Beyond the modern city centre lies the Lasnamäe suburb with its countless Soviet-style block apartment buildings.

St. Olav's Church and Tower

Once upon a time, from 1549 to 1625 to be precise, this Gothic church was the tallest building in the World. However, it's gigantic, 159-metre spire, meant as a signpost for approaching ships, also turned out to be a very effective lightning rod. Throughout the church's history lightning has hit the spire repeatedly, completely burning down the structure three times.

Seaplane Harbour, meremuuseum.ee/lennusadam/en/

The Seaplane Harbour accommodates one of Europe's grandest maritime museums. You are invited to see the authentic submarine Lembit from the 1930s, the century-old steam-powered icebreaker Suur Tõll, a Short 184 seaplane, mines, cannons and many other life-sized exhibits. The museum and the Seaplane Hangar have been recognised with a number of awards: Estonia's Most Tourist-Friendly Museum 2012, Europa Nostra Grand Prix 2013, Special Commendation from the European Museum of the Year 2014, and a number of others.

The Seaplane Harbour museum is a memorable experience for the whole family: lots of interesting reading, a voyage around the world in the Yellow Submarine, photos taken in naval uniforms, the big aquarium, the simulators and many more exciting activities.

Estonian Film Museum and Pirita Promenade

A long-time favourite of pedestrians, cyclists and skaters alike, the 2-km paved pathway of Pirita Promenade stretches along the water-front from Kadriorg to Pirita. It offers by far the most spectacular views of the Tallinn's rocky shoreline with the Old Town cityscape in the distance. The newly opened building of the Estonian Film Museum is located halfway from the centre to Pirita, in the Maarjamäe palace complex of the Estonian History Museum. Check out its permanent exhibition Take One and the temporary exhibition Film Posters: Visuals of the Last Century. The Film Museum hosts the reception of the Estonian EU Presidency Audiovisual Conference.

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

BEST PROJECT Eurimages Co-Production Development Award 20 000 Euros

The **Eurimages Co-Production Development Award** is given to the Best Project of the Baltic Event Co-Production Market, based on its artistic quality and potential for theatrical release. The project must be a European co-production between at least two member states of the Eurimages Fund from the outset, while the co-operation between partners must not be exclusively financial. The award, which takes the form of a non-reimbursable subsidy, must be used exclusively to cover project development costs.

EURIMAGES is a support fund for the co-production, distribution and exhibition of European cinematographic works, established by the Council of Europe in 1988. Since it was set up in 1988, EURIMAGES has supported 2 031 co-productions for a total amount of approximately 593 million euros.

Synopsis

Aria is a story of an absolute and devotional love, intense as if it were the first time, unconditional as if it were the last chance. It is also a story about love as a misconception and illusion, which is treacherous and destructive like an addiction.

On a job in Finland, during the white summer nights, the very formal Dutch architect Willem meets Lydia, a brilliant, intriguing, but chaotic and unstable literary translator. It is love at first sight. Back home in Rotterdam, he pleads with her to follow him. She warns him that she's trouble, but Willem insists. What follows is a maelstrom of emotions, of submission and rejection, a mental torment that is fought at the very edge of mind and body.

These two lovers, who met so unexpectedly, turn out to be two complex souls. The harmony they found in Finland is all too brief and elusive. During a hard, dark winter in Rotterdam, in the throes of sexual passion, they hurt each other, yet will not let go of the love they both had longed for. On a trip to Sierra Nevada that is like a desperate escape and last attempt at saving what has to be lost, they defy themselves and their lifelong expectations.

Director's note

The love story that *Aria* is, anticipates a contemporary Europe, free and without physical boundaries. Work and love can easily find each other in this mobile society. So it does for Lydia and Willem when they meet in Finland. Their love fits perfectly in our self-centred world that sells happiness and where truth is fluid. But what happens when Lydia starts feeling rootless and her hidden traumas start destroying Willem's perception of love? How do they deal with this neglected past? By labelling or parking it or just running away? No, the love in Aria overcomes, but not without developing into a relentless love for loved ones and their environment. Their eternal faith feels provocative and uncomfortable. In *Aria*, the ultimate consequence of this idea about love is investigated.

Director

Noud Heerkens (1954) is an independent filmmaker. In his film projects, he likes to investigate the limits of the medium and the crossover between film and other disciplines. Synopsis

After having an unwanted baby, 15-year-old Vika faces health issues, rejection by friends and community, and betrayal by the person who was her only hope for love. She decides to remove the main obstacle standing between her and a normal life.

Director's note

The film's central character, Vika, has a baby at the age of 15. Her sudden motherhood burdens her, she feels thrown out and discarded by the world around her. She tries to find the strength to cope with her new reality and the scope of new problems - but the pressure is too much for her to take. Vika yearns to break free from the suffocating atmosphere of her situation, but her desperate attempts only cause more suffering and exhaustion. At first glance, our film is about a desperate girl striving for freedom and the impossibility of attaining it. But below the surface lies another, deeper meaning: all of Vika's actions are dictated by her desire to feel loved - a desire she cannot fulfil in the world that confines her. Vika's father has long withdrawn from her, and Vika's mother is unable to show her daughter the feelings that she herself never experienced; her love for Vika is tough, suffocating, crippling; it feels more like hatred. Lovelessness is passed down through generations and predetermines Vika's attitude towards her baby daughter. She tries desperately to fill this void in her life, grabbing onto any illusion of love and trusting it to be real - but her world is totally permeated by the virus of lovelessness. Vika takes what she sees as the only way out. The path of destruction leads her to a tragic outcome, expected and appropriate in an environment where there is no love left.

Director

Lena Lansjih was born 1990 in Tyumen. At age 20, she moved to Moscow to pursue her career in directing and acting. After graduating from the Moscow School of New Cinema, Lena worked as a script supervisor and assistant director for Channel One Russia, TNT, NTV, as well as in independent cinema. She wrote and directed several short

films (*Type 8*, *Silent Mode*) that were featured at multiple Russian and international festivals, and garnered recognition and awards. Babydoll will be her debut feature.

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A BUTTERFLY'S HEART

Synopsis

This is the story of an eight-year-old boy named Juozapas, who is one in a million, because he was born with his heart outside of his chest and survived. Juozapas avoids interaction with children: the centre of his world is an old, deserted manor house and the insects he is raising there. His peace is disturbed when eight-year-old Rugile moves to town and it's time to go to school. After sharing various experiences, they gradually become friends.

A Butterfly's Heart is a movie for children, so this sensitive and even

Director's note

painful story is told in a light manner - gently, playfully. The inner world of the main character, Juozapas, is as fragile as a butterfly's wings. The story of his open heart has both direct and figurative meaning. Everything we see in the film is through the eyes of a child - halftones, both in terms of colour and detail. The main location - the abandoned old manor - envelops Juozapas's Bug Hotel with soft, pastel colours. This is the only place where Juozapas expresses himself, unafraid of intrusive glances, cloying pity or bullying. The movie has a lot of macros - Juozapas notices fine details, sees the insects' bodies and eyes, and observes their life. Rugilė is a cheery girl and is like a link between the closed world that Juozapas lives in and the surrounding environment. They feel each other's moods. The connection that forms between them is Juozapas's connection with the surrounding world. Rugilė inspires Juozapas with self-confidence. The mood at school is different – the mystery that surrounds the manor does not exist there. The camera captures the real world. The classmates aren't "bad guys", per se. Bullying is a part of their life, a natural thing - like a routine coming from an environment where there is intolerance for anything that is "different." The children simply don't understand Juozapas, who is more sensitive than they are. The main conflict of the film is internal. It is deep and strong. The misfortune that occurs makes everyone rethink their behaviour. Juozapas is accepted and he makes peace with the people around him. The film carries a good message: the world is not yet lost - all children are looking for goodness and reaching for it. We learn to understand someone who is "different"; we learn to apologise and to forgive.

Director

A graduate of cinema directing from the Lithuanian Music Academy. Inesa Kurklietyte also studied cinema directing in Paris Audio-Visual High school ESRA and Paris High School of Cinema Art FEMIS. Experienced in documentaries and short fiction films, awarded at international festivals, Kurklietyte stepped into the fiction world with the feature-length children's film Crow Lake.

Inesa Kurklietyte is a lecturer at Lithuanian Academy of Music and Theatre. She is the director of the Audiovisual Arts Industry Incubator and the International Summer MEDIA Studio, a workshop for young film professionals.

Producer

Zivile Gallego completed her management studies in Lithuania, France and the UK, and has studied filmmaking in NYFA, LA. After working as a producer at Lithuanian Film Studios from 2004, Gallego established her own production company Fralita Films in 2009. Within the company, she has produced over 10 films, released and awarded nationally and internationally.

She has left her son in the care of her old father, who lives in a Romanian village also on the Danube. Clara has been accepted by the family she is working for, almost replacing the role of the mother for the little Martha, whose mother had died. When her son goes missing in his attempt to reach his mother traveling up the Danube in a small boat, Clara has to return to Romania and face the life she left behind. She is torn between her failure as a mother and as a person, between her family in Romania and the chances of doing better in Germany with her "adoptive" family. She is a woman with few chances of really choosing a fate; she reacts to the exterior conditionings trying constantly to minimise the harm she is provoking in her attempt to do the best she can in a no-win situation.

Director's note

In 2014, I directed the short film *Way of the Danube*. It was a festival hit: over 20 awards and nominations. It also was awarded an Oscarqualifying festival and a unique screening in Eurovision. So, I decided to develop that short story in my first feature film Clara. It tells the story of a mother who has to face her failure in relation to her underage son while still hoping to prove her motherhood as a baby-sitter for a little girl in Germany. The poetry of this film is that the Danube river metaphorically connects the boy and his mother, Romania and Germany, east and west. It will be a touching and sensitive story, with strong emotions, presented in a very empathic way. Creating this film, I will rely on using strong visual style that will express the inner feelings of my main character.

Director

Sabin Dorohoi graduated from the Film Academy from Bucharest as a film director. He has produced short films and TV documentaries, some of which were selected to and awarded at film festivals

around the world. His internationally most acclaimed creation is the short film *Way of the Danube* (2013), which won the grand prize at Oscar-qualifying Chicago International Children's Film Festival, USA, a cinematography award at Capalbio, Italy, the Young Public Award at CINEMED, Montpellier, France, and was selected to many festivals around the world.

Producer

Daniel Burlac is a graduate in Film Direction from FEMIS in Paris, and he has also participated in the EAVE and ACE training programmes. He served as a production assistant on Alexandre Arcady's *Entre chiens et loups* (2000), Costa Gavras' *Amen* (2002), and Laurent Boutonnat's *Jacquou le croquant* (2005) as well as a promotion manager for Cristi Puiu's *The Death of Mr Lazarescu* (2005), which won the Grand Prix of Un Certain Regard. Synopsis

After surviving a deadly terrorist siege in a Moscow theatre 17 years ago, Natasha left her previous life behind. Coming out of the long reclusion she sought at a convent, Natasha (55) now returns to her hometown to organise a memorial evening. For a small fee, she rents the same theatre hall where the tragedy took place, to hold a "conference". as the head of the theatre officially calls the event.

Natasha is most determined to have her estranged daughter Galya (30) and former husband Oleg (55), survivors like herself, participate in the memorial evening. Natasha has not seen either for years. She discovers that Oleg is paralysed following a stroke, and her daughter is furious with the "conference" idea. Galya, who raises a child and takes care of her father all by herself, does not have time to live in the past nor understands what Natasha is trying to achieve. She also resents her mother for abandoning them. The two women fight.

Nevertheless, Natasha goes through with her plan, and in the course of one night, the theatre hall is filled with painful memories of those who still live. Cheap inflatable mannequins in different colours fill the empty seats of the victims and of those who did not want to come.

When her turn comes, Natasha confesses the terrible guilt that she has been living with since the attack: on the first night of the siege, Natasha escaped through the toilet window, leaving her family behind. This was the last time she saw her younger son alive.

Galya, who has come to the "conference" after all, listens to her mother's confession. Will Natasha earn her daughter's forgiveness? Will she ever find the strength to forgive herself, and say goodbye to the nast?

Director's note

The Conference is the story of one fragile family against the backdrop of one of the major tragedies of the 21st century in Russian history, the Nord-Ost siege that took place at Dubrovka Theatre in 2002, involved 850 hostages and ended with the death of at least 170 people.

My film is an attempt to create a cinematic reflection of the tragic events that begins as a private family story but goes beyond that. Our team plans a close collaboration with the participants of those events, including the former hostages and witnesses, representatives of the state authorities and the clergy. The film will use personal photos and videos of the survivors, TV and radio archive materials. We plan to shoot at the exact location of the siege. Professional actors will act along with the actual survivors side by side. Will they be able to find that unique intonation that can defeat fear in themselves, the authors of the film and the audience?

Director

Ivan I. Tverdovskiy graduated from the VGIK Film Institute in 2011, where he attended the experimental directing workshop of Alexei Uchitel. His first feature film *Correction Class* (2014) won numerous awards at Russian and international festivals, including the first prize of the East-West Competition and a Special Mention of the FEDEORA jury in Karlovy Vary, as well as awards in Thessaloniki, Seattle, Tallinn and Kyiv. His second film, *Zoology* (2016), won Best Director in Karlovy Vary and Best Film in Cottbus and Austin. *Jumpman* (2018), Tverdovsky's third feature, received the award for Best Director in Cottbus and a Special Mention at Karlovy Vary.

Producer

Katerina Mikhaylova is a founder of the film production company Vega Film, based in Moscow, Russia. After graduating from the Moscow State University of Foreign Affairs (MGIMO, Russia) and Bodo Graduate School of Business (HIBO, Norway), she has worked on a dozen of films across Eurasia, from the Atlantic coast to the Russian Pacific.

Synopsis

1993. Armenia and Azerbaijan are at war. Gardener Vahram's family learns that their son Gevorg is captured in Azerbaijan. Vahram hopes to free his son with the help of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Defence of Armenia, but all his hopes are in vain. Vahram understands that his son's life depends on himself alone. The Azerbaijani Mesair is busy with human trafficking. He suggests that Vahram exchange his son with another captured man. Gevorg can be exchanged with Hasil, a son of Ramin, an Azerbaijani, who used to be Vahram's neighbour until war had forced his family to escape. It is very hard for both Vahram and Ramin to admit that they pay money for their sons. It is even worse to admit that they are enemies. But there is no way out and they have to agree. Vahram makes a dangerous journey to Shushi to bring Hasil to the border. Ramin also has a difficult task – to get Gevorg out of the camp and bring him up to the border as well. The way to the exchange is long and full of unexpected obstacles.

Director's note

In spring 2016, I met a 40-year-old man in London. He told me the story of his being captured in 1993. For the purpose of the subsequent demand for redemption, he was taken to Azerbaijan by force. Back then, there was fierce fighting in Nagorno-Karabakh. He spent several months in captivity, while his father was busy trying to free him. This story full of humanism captured me and I started to write the script about two representatives of the warring nationalities based on a true story. The film will talk about their common pain and grief, and how, in a situation of war and occupation, both find themselves facing the same misfortune and problems, each making the journey full of obstacles in order to save the life of his son. The war itself will not be shown in the film. Everything happens in the background. The shooting is planned in the Tavush region of Armenia.

Director

Sergo Ustyan is an Armenian film director, writer, and producer based in London, UK. In 2010-2015, he studied film directing at the Russian

State Institute of Cinematography (VGIK, Sergey Solovievs' workshop). His short films have screened at various film festivals (Golden Apricot Yerevan IFF, Beijing International Student Film and Video Festival, Batumi Art-House IFF, St. Anna International Short Film Festival in Moscow and others). In 2017, Sergo's debut film project *The Exchange* was among the three selected by the Ministry of Culture of Armenia to be showcased at the Armenian pavilion in Cannes.

Synopsis

A secret service officer wiretaps a neighbouring apartment where an influential oligarch corrupts hi-ranking politicians. By collecting clear evidence of the oligarch's illegal activities, the officer faces blackmailing, intelligence games, and threats to his family. What sacrifices will it take to reveal one of the biggest corruption scandals in the history of Eastern Europe?

Director's note

Our story, although all the characters are fictional due to legal reasons, is based on a real case, in which a combination of coincidence and individual determination helped expose the biggest corruption affair in Slovak history. That fact is important for me and my view of the film through the eyes of a director. I would like the characters to be as realistic as possible, without exaggeration or posing.

The past months have revealed a lot from the backstage of Slovak politics that is full of absurd individuals and relations, so the reality does not need to be made more vivid, it is absurd and surprising enough, only the right inspiration and bringing that world on the screen is needed.

It is interesting that despite the general awareness of the case, the life story of the person behind the affair is very little known in Slovakia and that's why the film can be very attractive for Slovak viewers. International viewers will understand the film easily because corruption works the same way everywhere.

Director

Jonas Karasek graduated from the Academy of Visual Arts in Bratislava, worked as an Art Director for Leo Burnett advertising agency in Bratislava, McMann&Tate agency in Sydney. In 2009, he established his own company GunPowder creative studio. He is a renowned director of commercials and has won a number of national and international awards on different commercial festivals around the world.

Producer

Wanda Adamik Hrycova graduated from VSMU in 2001, majoring in TV and Film Production. In 2001-2006, she worked as the General Director in Nova Scena Theatre, the biggest musical theatre in Slovakia. In 2010-2012, she worked as the General Director in Media Pro Entertainment Slovakia, a production company that was producing the entire local content for TV Markiza. From TV she left to give birth to her three sons and during her maternity leave she produced two films - the world war II drama Colette (CZ/SK, dir. 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THE GOLDEN SPOT

Synopsis

It takes courage to admit that you have given up on your dreams and Marta, once an emerging and successful film director, apparently does not have it. Now in her 30s, she spends her days working at a job she hates, getting high with her annoying boyfriend, and lying to her friends that she will "soon" start working on her new script, while barely handling the tasks at hand. Her life seems to sway both in comic and tragic directions: it's sometimes a mix of ultimate freedom, sex, drugs, friendship, laughter, alcohol, lots of alcohol, music, honesty and love, and sometimes the reality Marta refuses to face becomes so brutal that she can't take it anymore. Through the course of the film, Marta learns there is an unavoidable question that at some point becomes inevitable for almost every filmmaker: if you really want to direct films, can you first direct yourself out of depression?

Director's note

Most of the episodes for *The Golden Spot* are taken and adapted directly from my life, so the screenplay can be considered largely autobiographic. My aim is to make a film that would be as contemporary as possible, showing the life of the 30-somethings today from a realistic and self-experienced point of view. Sex life, substance abuse, friends and pets occupying the mental space traditionally reserved for family, unfulfilling romantic relationships, demons from our unhappy youth, sexual micro aggressions towards women, abundance and yet lack of life choices, new and untraditional work opportunities, constant state of anxiety and harmful ways of coping with it – these are the aspects that I find characteristic to my generation and yet they are often omitted from the narratives of contemporary films from this region of Europe. I would like to change that.

The Golden Spot explores how to deal with artistic ambitions while also being deeply human – flawed, weak, overwhelmed. It is also a script that employs female gaze: it deals with the female worldview that often includes women being more insecure than men and refraining to take the position of authority (e. g. becoming a film director); it shows a woman being a sexual subject, not an object (women can also feel sexual desire and take pleasure from sex, not just be desir-

able and pleasing); "female gaze" in terms of filmmaking, to my mind, also means paying more attention to sensuality onscreen. These are the elements that are often missing in cinema, and this is where my film can come in. My ambition is to make a film that would talk about all of the above-mentioned aspects in a non-stupid way. I believe I feel where the golden spot is – that it is possible to make a smart, narratively complex and rousing film that would also appeal to mainstream audience. I have two main tools – humour, as laughter is the most cathartic way to talk about pain, and, most of all, honesty.

Director

Liene Linde (1986) is a Latvian film director and critic. Her short films have won prizes at national and international film festivals. She is currently working on her debut feature.

Selected filmography: Seven Awkward Sex Scenes. Part One (fiction, 2016, 25'), Earth Is the Loneliest Planet (fiction, 2015, 13'), Fake Me a Happy New Year (fiction, 2013, 35')

THE GOOD DRIVER

Synopsis

Ivan, a Bulgarian taxi driver living at a Golden Sands tourist resort, is saving money in order to go back to Finland to meet his wife and son, and to make amends for his past mistakes.

In order to earn faster, Ivan rigs his taxi meter and starts cheating tourists. One day, Ivan cheats the wrong customer. He's betrayed by his best friend Ludmil. Mobsters running local taxi companies beat Ivan up, seize all his savings and force him to leave the Golden Sands.

Ivan returns to his home village by the Turkish border and starts trafficking asylum seekers. He's caught by the border police and jailed. Ludmil, who has meanwhile stolen money from the mobsters, turns up and bails him out. The two friends travel to Finland to meet Ivan's family and to see if there's a way for reconciliation.

Ivan's wife and son reject his help. He and Ludmil decide to return home and give the money to someone who needs it more.

Director's note

As a person coming from a small town in Bulgaria and having moved to Finland to study and work, the topic of seeking a better life resonates with my own experiences. And so does the fear of failure and desire to make amends for one's past mistakes and misfortunes. After graduating from a film school in Helsinki, I found it hard to find work and returned to Bulgaria for a while. I felt like I had failed, wasted years of my life and disappointed my then wife. Fortunately, my luck changed, and I moved back to Finland to make films. But those few months filled with a sense of utter failure have never completely left me

This is what haunts Ivan, our main character. This is the motivation behind his actions

For me, the story of *The Good Driver* is also very contemporary in a more general way. The three main locations and characters in them are geographically only a couple of hours away from each other and

belong to the same European political entity. Yet they could not look and feel more different. Nevertheless, I believe—and know—that the hopes and fears of people in each of these places are exactly the same.

Director

Tonislav Hristov (b. 1978) is a filmmaker born in Bulgaria, based in Finland and Bulgaria. He has directed seven documentary films. *The Magic Life of V* was selected to both Sundance World Documentary Competition 2019 and Berlinale Generation 14+ in 2019. *The Good Postman* premiered 2017 at IDFA Feature Length Competition and had its North American premier in Sundance World Documentary Competition 2017. It was also nominated for the European Film Awards 2017.

His other documentaries have been also screened at numerous festivals like Tribeca, Shanghai, Sarajevo, Sofia, Hot Docs, Karlovy Var, Visions du Réel etc.

The Good Driver is Tonislav's debut feature.

Director's note

Billy Elliot meets Borg vs McEnroe in this coming-of-age dramedy about a boy from a Polish refugee family, who dreams of becoming a tennis player. The lives of our characters will be filled with uplifting and tough situations, laugh-out-loud and emotional moments. The visual style will be raw and energetic. The framing will be bold and constantly on the move, the pacing will be fast. The period details alongside a nostalgic soundtrack will be present but will never overwhelm the story or characters whose dreams and ambitions will have a timeless, inspiring quality.

Director

Filip Syczyński is a director and a screenwriter. His pool of genes and humour are reflected in his multidisciplinary work stemming from a diverse collision of painting, music and photography. He has been fortunate enough to work with directors such as David Lynch and Adrian McDowell. His movies have been screened at festivals around the world (Sundance FF, Cannes FF). Recently, he worked on *Maty Zgon*,

Synopsis

Horia, a shy, yet charming 17-year-old boy was born and raised in a Romanian village by his libertine father, Petrică. After graduating from high school, he gets his heart broken by the girl he madly loves. On an impulse, he decides to take his father's old motorcycle and ride it illegally across the country in order to pursue her. The journey doesn't go as he imagines, as many obstacles appear along the way. He meets new people, from his father's ex-lover to a traveling circus band, and ends up accompanied for a while by Stela, a young, spunky, street-smart child from an underprivileged family, who complicates his journey at first, but by the end of it, teaches him a lot about life. All the things that happen to Horia change his perspective of the moment, as he learns to let go of what cannot be changed and to enjoy life as much as he can.

Director's note

Horia grows up by becoming aware of his vulnerabilities and fears in the face of adversity, but also of the ever-present beauty around him. I see his journey as essentially being a carpe diem manifesto. The tone of the film shall be positive, imbued with candour, emotion and sometimes humour. From a visual standpoint, I am proposing a fresh reinterpretation of rural Romanian landscapes in the aesthetic of the great American open roads, symbolising freedom. Progressing from a village to the fields and then to the mountains, I aim for careful, stylish compositions, full of colour, enhanced by natural sunlight in various hues. The motorcycle he rides is a Mobra, a notorious national brand of the Communist era. All of these elements build the escapism of the film, underlined as well by an eclectic soundtrack containing plenty of obscure Romanian progressive rock tunes from the 60s and 70s.

Director

Ana-Maria Comănescu is a Romanian writer-director whose work comprises of fiction shorts of various themes and styles, such as the black and white film about a party gone wrong, *In the House* (2014), *Second Look* (2015), a road movie about a couple who befriends a

hitchhiker, and *Sex, Pipe and Omelette* (2016), a satirical anecdote on marriage and mid-life crisis, all during her studies at the UNATC Bucharest. She has worked on various projects both as an assistant director and as a freelancing director. In 2017, she attended Sarajevo Talents. She is now developing her debut feature, *Horia*, a mix between a coming-of-age and a road movie.

Producers

Ada Solomon is a Romanian producer and the founder of Hi Film Productions and microFILM. 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NEVER ENOUGH WHITE ROS ES

Synopsis

Never Enough White Roses is an episodic film about love and longing, disappointments, fears, traumas and hope and the last supper party of the summer. After this evening nothing will be the same again.

Thematically the film examines the parent-child relationship. What do we want to express, when we want to have a child? Why do we choose or don't choose parenthood?

The main character is Senja. The repeated miscarriages have casted a dark shadow over her and her husband Lauri. Senja is exhausted and Lauri is numb. Their marriage is crumbling.

The present events happen on the very last warm summer's day. A supper party is being arranged for family and friends. The wife is getting ready for the evening and the husband has gone out to buy more white roses. Everything seems to be in place in this airy, stylish home; wines are cooling, and the table is set. The air is filled with expectation.

We see the guests getting ready for the party in their own homes. And one by one arriving at this supper party. Moments pass by. But the husband has not returned home yet.

With flashbacks, we show the main characters' pasts as someone's child - loved or rejected. These scenes move between a beautiful summer idyll to a chilling autumnal hell - destroying our most cherished ideas of parenthood and childhood and exposing the related traumas and fears. Ambiances take us from despair to hope and from tender bliss to intense, searing pain.

Director's note

The episodic structure is something I want to preserve in the film. Each couple and individual of the story is full of conflicts. We only need to show the painful moments, the collisions and not everything needs to be directly recounted.

The visual narrative and editing is peaceful. No hand-held camera used.

The music is classical and composed for the film. The film features slow-motion pictures and a repeated musical theme accompanying the main characters throughout the film. Flashbacks introduce us to the characters and their stories and pasts, to the truths that alternate with the present evening and lies.

We will build the main characters' apartment in a studio, in co-production with Roy Andersson and his team. Timo Salminen is our cinematographer, who gives his own great talent for the film. The shooting format is 35mm film.

Director

Miika Soini is an award-winning director, born in 1973 in Rusko, Finland. He studied acting and theatre directing at Turku Arts Academy in Western Finland before turning to cinema. He studied film directing in Helsinki at the University of Art and Design, during which he shot four short films: For the Sake of God, Objective Love, Grey Area and Relation. His first feature film, Thomas, had its international premiere at San Sebastian Film Festival in 2008. Thomas has since toured over 40 film festivals, winning eight awards. After Thomas, Soini has been directing TV-series, music videos, commercials and has been writing and developing his next feature film Never Enough White Roses.

Producer

Tiina Butter is the founding partner in Butterworks. She is a dedicated filmmaker with a long experience in the film industry. She graduated as a film producer (MA) from the University of Art and Design in Helsinki. She has produced feature, documentary and commercial films for both national and international audiences. Synopsis

The film's leading character Enn Padrik learns that he's suffering from a serious illness, which propels him to set off on a journey he has long been putting off – he wants to find out the actual circumstances of his daughter's death. In order to find out what led his daughter Anni to commit group suicide at a religious commune, Enn must travel through parts of Estonia and even to Germany to meet with key figures from Anni's life. Enn relies on both their and his own memories to try and reconstruct the truth about what happened, but soon a picture emerges that is far more complicated and terrible than he could have anticipated, and inevitably, he finds himself asking if it would have been smarter to leave the past undisturbed.

Director's note

Reconstruction is based on the novel of the same name by Rein Raud and tells the story of Enn Padrik who is embarking on a journey he has long been putting off finding out what led his unreligious daughter Anni to commit group suicide in a religious commune. What follows is a father-daughter journey during which Enn has to reconcile the daughter he remembers with the person Anni had become over the course of her life. This is a story of a father's grief, reconciliation and forgiveness.

Although the story revolves around Anni's death, our main character is still Enn. He is our guide and proxy in this story and it's through him that we experience the events that happened to his daughter in the past. We get to experience some of them through Enn's own memories and the rest through the people Anni had met. It's through these moments that we understand how differently people saw Anni and what she meant to them. Everything that Enn doesn't learn will also remain unknown to the viewer.

Enn's tragedy lies in his attempt to find truth and reconciliation in a place that doesn't allow any do-overs. But this lets us get up close to the kind of unconditional love that a father might feel for his daughter throughout his life in spite of everything.

His ability to hold on to the highest ideals of being human – his humanity – despite the turbulences, doubts and ordeals he faces, is one of the warmest and most beautiful aspects of this tragic story. Anyone who manages to remain human in this chaotic world of today should be considered a hero.

Likewise, Anni's own growth throughout the film is also very important. She's charismatic, extremely intelligent, well read and openminded. Anni hates hypocrisy more than anything in the world and she seems to be doing the right thing by fighting it – she protects the weak and is honest and principled in her actions and words. Although this may seem like the ideal self-image for any human being, it's still a nail in her coffin, since Anni will inevitably find herself in a situation where she realises that she has unconsciously become as hypocritical as everybody else. As the events unfold, she becomes, in a trivial manner, a hostage to her own noble and high ideals.

Director

Evar Anvelt has been working in the film industry for the past 15 years in various production and post-production roles, such as 1st AD and colour grade, and he is also one of the founders of Nafta Films. Evar's first short film *The Good Shepherd*, filmed in Lebanon in 2018, did the rounds at many internationally recognised film festivals.

Producer

Andreas joined Nafta Films in 2014 after graduating from Tallinn University's Baltic Film, Media, Arts and Communication School with a degree in Film Production. At Nafta Films, Andreas has been managing and administrating the films and TV series that are in development and in preproduction, assisting the producers as well as developing the company's marketing and international relations.

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THE SEAL MOTHER

Synopsis

Kaya (42) is a trainer and keeper at the seal sanctuary in Hel, Poland on the Baltic coast.

Work is her passion; she's helping to re-establish an endangered species – the Baltic grey seal. Every year, she prepares young seals born in the seal research centre for independent life in the wild waters of the Baltic Sea. Kaya lives in a flat on an estate near her mother. She strongly desires to have a child. Unfortunately, after a long affair with a married man who doesn't want to leave his wife and start a family with her, she is single. Her relationship with a controlling and possessive mother becomes more and more problematic for her, and her desire to have a child grows. She secretly decides to become a single mother – by using sperm from an anonymous donor and impregnating herself using IVF. Financial, ethical and legal difficulties appear. She fights against them and against time, which turns out to be her greatest opponent.

Unfortunately, in Poland in November 2015 a new law comes into force prohibiting IVF for single mothers. Finally, Kaya decides to move to Sweden, where she begins a new life as a university lecturer. After a few years working at a university, she gives birth to a daughter.

Director's note

The Seal Mother is a film about motherhood set within the context of contemporary assisted reproductive technology. In spite of it being socially-engaged cinema, I treat the film as an intimate, universal story about a woman who is willing to pay any price to have a child, without which she's deeply unhappy and for whom only the achievements of contemporary medicine are capable of changing her life. The accumulation of obstacles Kaya encounters show how hostile the world can be towards women who challenge the status quo. In the film, the instinctive behaviour of animals towards Kaya are more helpful to her than cruel man-made laws. The film shows that the bond between human beings and nature is primeval, forgotten but not lost, that there are still people who can live in a mysterious symbiosis with animals,

which gives them strength and solace. Kaya, as a single woman wanting to have a child, pays a high price for that need. She has to overcome a series of psychological barriers; from buying sperm, through acceptance of the fact that owing to her age she's infertile, to taking the decision to adopt another woman's egg cells. It thus deals with the preparation for a new kind of mothership, where a woman gives birth to a child from an adopted egg cell and an anonymous donor's sperm. This situation opens up a new area of reflection about what motherhood is. The subject, which deals with the phenomena of a new ethics around the issues of assisted reproductive technology, hasn't yet been overdone in world cinema.

Director

Agnieszka Trzos was born in Warsaw in 1971. She graduated from Warsaw University and Polish Film School in Lodz. She is a director, screenwriter and producer.

Synopsis

On the shores of Lake Chad, a group of strangers are sent on a mission to transport ice boxes containing medical vaccinations to a remote island community that has been devastated in a Boko Haram attack.

Director's note

This film is unique for two reasons: first, no film has been attempted set on Lake Chad, and second, the film is concerned with a long-term real-life problems in a large region of sub-Saharan Africa affecting millions of people. We are speaking truth because it is based on a true story. The events take place every day on the lake: the tragic abyss of fear and hate balanced against towering love and the beauty of existence, and the triumph of the human spirit above all, and this is why we need to deliver this powerful film for people to see.

The story line is a straight line and is propelled by urgent dramatic forces. So, it is first and foremost a universal story concerned with moving forwards, an account of true perseverance and endurance and of triumph against the odds. The film also subtly documents many pressing humanitarian issues specific to the Sahel region. These include the terrorist threat posed by Boko Haram in the islands of the vast Lake Chad basin; the refugee crisis in the Sahel; and the problems relating to the transportation of medication to remote and isolated communities.

Stylistically, the power of the film resides in sustained high-tension sequences composed by beautiful, simple images. Through the labyrinth of waterways and lagoons the men pass, as shifting sands frame the canoe on the mirror of water and the violent power of the sun renders colours in high contrasts. The audience will smell the sweat pouring from their brows and suffocate among the aquatic lianas that stall their passage. The swarming flies become deafening and threaten to break our minds.

The screenplay establishes high stakes in the first act, but aesthetically this film will have an overwhelming, existential effect. The sparse

dialogue will sit carefully within the rhythmical structure of the film, punctuating long, suspenseful sequences. The camera will be patient. Events and sequences will unfold like a dream from which the editor will assemble carefully paced, tense, feverish sequences that give a strong impression of atmosphere and internal psychological turmoil. As comparisons I might give The Revenant by Iñarritu, Sorcerer by Friedkin and Aguirre, Wrath of God by Herzog. Occasional humour will juxtapose the desperate struggle of the lives of the protagonists and will re-enforce the mental fortitude of the men.

Casting has already commenced in N'djamena and several actors are already cast in minor roles, including Youssef Djaoro. We are reliant on strong performances and we will search the country to find the leading characters. There will be no visible acting in this film: the actors will be perfectly cast, so that they sink into the role as they sink into mud in the lake.

It will be a challenging project to direct, but I believe that the production strategy is coherent and that the logistics for the filming are not so difficult as they appear.

Director

Issa Serge Coelo (born 1967) is a Chadian film director. Born in Biltine, Chad, he studied history in Paris and film at the Ecole Supérieure de Réalisation Audiovisuelle (ESRA). He then worked at Métropole Télévision, France 3, TV5MONDE and CFI before directing the short film *Un Taxi pour Aouzou* (1994). The film was well-received, being nominated for a 1997 César Award in the category Best Short Film Fiction. This was followed by the feature films *Daresalam* (2001) and *Tartina City* (2007). Aside from his creative work, Issa Serge manages the Normandie cinema in N'djamena, Chad, which is the only independent cinema in central francophone Africa.

Producer

Wilf Varvill (born 1982) is a British-Norwegian producer and writer. Having trained as a linguist and a lawyer in London, he worked from

2006 in feature film acquisitions at Focus Features and Universal Pictures International and he subsequently produced and directed several short films. Until 2018 he worked at completion guarantor European Film Bonds (EFB) where he was closely involved with the financing and oversight of over 50 feature film productions with budgets ranging from £1.5m to £45m, including Lars von *Trier's The House that Jack Built* and David Robert Mitchell's *Under the Silver Lake*.

Synopsis

It is soon apparent that the close-knit rural community Jasper once lived in does not want him back. After Jasper frightens a woman in a local shop, the Reverend declares from his pulpit that not all sins are forgivable. He urges his congregation to follow their own moral compasses of what is wrong and right.

Jasper says he's all done with trouble and even comes clean to Joanne about the heinous crime he had committed... In a forgotten prairie town that knows no forgiveness, it does not take long for trouble to call round

Director's note

There is something hypnotic, almost magical about the world of this story. The breathing, the glancing, the dead air and the ever-humming noise of the insects.

I want to heighten certain aspects of the story, lift them into something beautiful and poetic. The hyper real brutality of the Texan Prairie, the strange dilemma and fear of the townsfolk. The unbearable tension of Lizzie's conflict, her uncertainty about the man she has let back into her home. The unsettling indifference of Jasper at times and the child like intrigue of Joanne.

All these elements will bubble beneath the strangely still surface of our story, occasionally breaking through in moments that will lash out and cut deep.

A major character in the book is the location. The heat and the landscape of Texas play a major role in setting the tone and creating the atmosphere. The quiet intensity of the setting will inform the approach. The performances and the visuals will be wound tight. Controlled yet unpredictable. I want this film to feel dangerous throughout.

Director

Stevie Russell attended the National Film school of Ireland where he received a distinction and was awarded student of the year in 2008. He spent the early part of his career as a DOP and moved into directing at age 25. His first ever project was nominated in the Cannes Young Director awards (YDA). He has since won in the YDA and was nominated a further two times. His work is all about eliciting an emotional response through strong visuals and engaging narrative.

Stevie is also currently represented by the prestigious Creative Arts Agency in Los Angeles.

Kevin Coyne (15) is a teenage boy who is used to living in his brother Robbie's (18) shadow. So, he is surprised when Hanna (16), the pretty newcomer to this West Cork parish, seems to prefer his company. It's late Summer and Robbie is waiting to discover if he's been accepted into the Cadets, the army's officer training unit, thereby fulfilling the hopes and dreams of Larry, his retired soldier father, Meanwhile, black sheep Kevin keeps on getting into trouble thereby further alienating himself from his demanding father. While grounded, he manages to sneak away with Hanna, and they find a wounded Sparrow with a broken wing. Kevin takes it back home with him, promising to nurse it back to health. Despite the confusing mixed signals Kevin gets from Hanna, he gears himself up for becoming more than just friends at an upcoming party, but he gets too drunk and messes up; later discovering to his disgust that Robbie and Hanna have fallen for each other. His life takes a fateful turn the next morning, when, on confronting Robbie while out on a fishing trip at the lake, he inadvertently causes Robbie's death. Shocked and unable to confront what he's done, Kevin does something seemingly unforgivable. He lies about what happened. Kevin then must watch in horror as the consequences of his lie unfold before his eyes and the only living soul, he is able to confess it to is the sparrow he now keeps in a box in his room. As events inevitably escalate out of Kevin's control, he is forced to confront the truth in the most dramatic of fashions. Finally, with the truth out there, Kevin must look to his father to provide the very thing he needs most: the possibility of forgiveness.

Director's note

A moody, tense, slow burner set against the wild beauty of Ireland, *The Sparrow* is a coming-of-age drama that explores guilt, grief, family dysfunction and the effects of a toxic father/son relationship on a teenage boy to devastating affect.

My aim with the film is to pluck the deepest chords of empathy in an audience with a strongly authored, cinematic vision that doesn't sentimentalise or trivialise the emotional heart of the story. The core of the drama is an exploration of the consequences of Kevin's lie but the

heart of the emotional story is Kevin's relationship with his father, Larry. In dramatising this relationship I'm seeking to explore the damaging effects of the denial of the feminine and its association with weakness. Moreover, I'm seeking to reveal how, in the war zone of family dysfunction, the repressed, unresolved emotional trauma of one generation gets passed down to the next.

The ultimate intention of the film then is to make an audience feel: to feel empathy, to feel hope for the possibility of forgiveness and to feel the redemptive light of genuine catharsis.

Director

Michael Kinirons is an Irish screenwriter and director. He studied directing at the National Film and Television School in London, is an award-winning director of five short films and is an alumnus of the Berlinale Talent Campus and the Torino Film Lab.

His first produced feature script, *Strangerland*, had its world premiere at the Sundance Film Festival in 2015 and stars Nicole Kidman, Joseph Fiennes and Hugo Weaving. *The Sparrow* is his debut feature as director

Alicia studied English and Irish at University College Dublin and went on to complete a Masters in Screen Writing and Screen Directing at Drama Centre, Central Saint Martins, London.

Alicia has produced, written and directed four short films. Her most recent short film, *The Pike*, starring Sinéad Cusack, is currently on the festival circuit. Alicia is a reader for a number of screen agencies and is also a story liner for RTE's long running TV drama, *Fair City*. She is currently producing the feature films, *The Sparrow* and *The Cellist* as well as the TV series The Pretender, all of which are being development by Screen Ireland.

Synopsis

Irina is a single and overprotective mother, and impulsive police officer who cannot find her place in a work environment where aspirations for promotion are cut short. A call announces her that her mother is seriously ill and must return to the place, from which she escaped more than a decade ago: her hometown.

Irina refuses to go back, but after beating a suspect, Irina must take a couple of days off. Along with her teen daughter, with whom she has a difficult and distant relationship, she travels from Buenos Aires to a remote town in Patagonia, in southern Argentina. Her mother is a sad and lonely woman since Irina, as a teenager, killed her abusive father in her mother's defence. The woman's illness makes them stay there longer than thought, leading to a gruelling routine, but she gradually reconciles with her daughter and reunites with her only friend in the small town.

After a couple of days, her friend's teenager daughter is killed in indigenous territories. The small town turns against the indigenous community leading to violent acts. Since there are very few police officers to cover a huge area, her friend asks Irina for help to investigate what happened with her daughter.

Working on a case that seems to have no solution, Irina must find the balance between the professional and personal issues in her life. While her mother's condition worsens, she moves more and more away from her daughter and the small town's dark secrets begin to come to light.

Director's note

The Thaw stemmed from the banishment that many young people have suffered leaving our cities of origin for studies or work, where today we are still trying to balance our personal and professional life with the problems that it generates. For this, I created a character with whom I deeply identify by the situations she is going through. Irina is a single mother who tries to earn a place within her work and society, while facing her fears of the past and present to break down preju-

dices and thus forging her own destiny defying the pre-established models of society.

Director

Facundo Escudero Salinas was born in 1986 in Mar del Plata, Argentina. There, he directed his first short films, one of which earned him a scholarship to study at the Cinematographic Research Center in Buenos Aires.

He has worked as a scriptwriter and producer of fiction and documentary feature films. Currently, he develops his debut film The Thaw along with his second feature film The Preacher and the TV Series *The Pack*. In 2019, he was selected to participate in TALENTS BA (Berlinale-FUC).

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
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

When Miervaldis attends mass, he encounters an old man who offers him to get out of the city and work on a remote farm. When Miervaldis arrives, he discovers that the farm is not exactly as he had imagined. It is split apart by two rival families of demigods, both of which seem to be completely mental. Miervaldis has no other choice, but to take the

situation in his own hands and restore peace at the farm, which has been disrupted since time immemorial.

During their search, the activists discover a mysterious black monolith in the basement, which at first seems to be a treasure, but soon turns out to be a deadly threat. Trapped in the cellar vault with an infectious monster, the high moral standards of the activists disintegrate, and the group falls apart. To make things worse, the police have surrounded the building, and the group's controversial leader turns out to be a cowardly traitor. Unable to escape, the activists are killed one after the other.

Thanks to the brave and selfless actions of Zoe, who at the beginning was just in it for the thrill, the few surviving activists are able to defeat the monster and stop the infection before it spreads out across the entire world.



Studija 2 was established as a merger of two independent film studios, the cinema company Litnek, represented by Mr. Arunas Stoskus, and the film studio Studija 2000, represented by Mr. Kestutis Petrulis. The founders have been collaborating for many years and hold an extensive experience working with most known Lithuanian filmmakers both in fiction and documentary films.


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
